## DuPage Children's Museum Saves with Energy Efficiency

(Naperville, IL) – DuPage Children's Museum was awarded a grant of \$8,383 by Illinois Clean Energy Community Foundation to assist in upgrading to energy-efficient lighting fixtures, which will result in an estimated savings ranging from \$3,000 to \$4,000 per year.

“We're thrilled not only to support Illinois Clean Energy's goals, making the Museum a more energy-efficient building, but also to be wise stewards of DCM's precious funds,” says Kim Stull, DCM's Director of Operations. “This grant money helped us purchase and install energy-efficient fixtures with electric ballasts, which control energy flow more effectively, as well as energy efficient bulbs.
